Born in Thessaloniki, Greece in 1982. She is an Assistant Professor at the Laboratory of Anatomy and Histology, Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, School of Health Sciences, Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, Greece. She holds a DVM degree (2006) and a PhD in neuroscience (2015). She teaches comparative anatomy, topographical-clinical anatomy and histology to students at the School of Health Sciences, AuTh. She has published 30 papers in peer reviewed journals and 3 book chapters and has performed 25 oral and 40 poster presentations in national or international conferences. Her research interests include animal modeling of devastating CNS diseases and study of endogenous neural stem cells in health and disease. Since 2014 she is the Head of the Experimental and Research Center (ERC) of Papageorgiou General Hospital in Thessaloniki, and the authorized laboratory animal veterinarian of ERC's animal facility. She is an experienced laboratory animal veterinarian, employed in experimental protocols that involved the anesthesia, peri- and post-operative care and monitoring of small and large animal models. Over the last ten years she has participated in about 35 experimental protocols, all of which included the use of animal models. She is a member of the committee for the evaluation of experimental protocols in three individual experimental facilities located in Thessaloniki, Greece, and the President of ERC's animal welfare committee. She has participated in the organizing and scientific committees of 9 national and international conferences and hands-on seminars.
